## Message from the Fire Department: October is Fire Prevention Month

Fire Prevention Month is a great time to remember these fire safety tips for your home.

**Smoke Alarms:** A good time to check your smoke alarms and change the batteries is when you change your clocks twice a year as daylight savings time begins and ends. Smoke alarms with non-replaceable 10-year batteries are designed to remain effective for up to 10 years. If the alarm chirps, warning that battery is low, replace the entire smoke alarm right away. Smoke alarms with any other type of battery need a new battery at least once a year. If that alarm chirps, replace the battery right away.

## Open Burning Regulations

Now that the fall season is here, residents are reminded of the Township's opening burning regulations. Open burning is permitted within Liberty Township as long as the location of the open burning is greater than 50 ft. from any structure and provisions are made to prevent fire from spreading within 50 ft. of any structure.
